HIGHLIGHTS

REFRIGERATION UPGRADES

Staff leveraged funding from CommonSpirit Health to secure thousands of dollars in donated supplies that helped complete an off-the-grid refrigeration unit at the Frisco Transit Center. The additional unit helped staff reallocate more time to growing. Additionally, new refrigerators at the WIC site kept food fresh for families unable to make designated pickup days.

REACHING THE WHOLE FAMILY

WIC's goal is to help keep pregnant women, breastfeeding moms, and children younger than age 5 healthy. Since Grow to Share benefits extend to the entire family, our work helps babies, moms, dads, grandparents, older children and teens realize the benefits of fresh, healthy produce.

WEATHERING CHALLENGES

A cool, wet spring and pest issues made for a difficult growing season. Yet, produce grown by HC3 slightly increased over last year. Given the program's continued and significant growth over the last three seasons, 2023 remains a success, with 34 families served weekly. Returning staff and volunteers reduced training time and the installation of drip irrigation at the medical offices reduced watering time.

HONORING STAFF

After the 2022 passing of longtime Assistant Farmer Chelsea Coye, staff commissioned a mural in her honor. The piece was completed in fall 2023.
